Instructions for patients after adenoidectomy

After surgery, you/your child will remain in hospital under observation for a short period and will be discharged home when stable.

After discharge:

- You/your child may experience some minor pain. Administer *Paracetamol* according to weight and age of the patient and the directions on your particular brand of medication. *Gentle nose blowing* may commence 24 hours after surgery if necessary.
- *No bright bleeding is to be expected* from the nostrils. If any bright bleeding is seen, *call the contact number you have been given.* Some old, dark blood may be noticed, this is generally not an emergency.
- *Ear pain* is often associated with this surgery. Administration of *Paracetamol* as previously stated should help with this minor problem. Similarly, *throat pain* as a result of the anaesthetic tube may be experienced. This will pass after 24 hours; Paracetamol will also assist in relieving this pain.
- *A light diet* is advised on return home for the remainder of the day of the operation. *Normal diet* can be recommenced the next day.
- *Strenuous activity* should be avoided for the first 24 hours.
- *Return to participation* in activities, school or child care activities can recommence *1-2 days* following discharge from hospital.
- *Medical certificates* for patients and/or carers can be obtained by calling the rooms on 4737 3396.
- <u>Nepean Public Hospital patients</u> *a follow up appointment* will be conducted at the outpatients clinic and Dr Para will indicate the time frame.
- <u>Westmead Private Hospital patients</u> *a follow up appointment* has already been arranged. Please review your letter from the practice or check with our medical secretary on 4737 3396.
